



Message from the Senior Pastor Rev. Dan Bogre



Dear Friends and Family of RRUMC,

As I put this article together for the year-end report of the Theo & Belle Moll Society, I am reminded of a Scripture from the Gospel of John. In chapter 17, Jesus is praying for his disciples as he anticipates his forthcoming arrest and crucifixion. In verses 20 and 21, Jesus says, "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who WILL believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you."

Jesus is not only praying for those in the Upper Room with him that evening, but he is also praying for all those who WILL be part of the church for generations and generations to come.

That is exactly what the Theo & Belle Moll Society is all about. The people who have chosen to be part of that society have informed the church that they have included Rocky River United Methodist Church in their will and estate planning or have chosen to give directly to the church's endowment during their lifetime. As you know, we say, "It's all about the story. We exist to help people meet Jesus Christ in the midst of their story." When people of this church become part of the Theo & Belle Moll Society, they have chosen to make a difference in people's stories for generations to come. Just as Jesus prayed for all those who will come to believe in him long before they actually do, people in the Moll Society are doing the same thing through their financial commitment and generosity. They are making sure that we are helping people meet Jesus Christ in the midst of their story long after they have gone on to the church triumphant.

It is earnings from the endowment that allow us to absorb large plant costs without skipping a beat in the overall day-to-day operations of the church. For example, as described in the Trustees' letter in this report, earnings from the endowment allowed us to replace the air handler immediately. Many churches would have to do a capital campaign to raise that amount of money. Some churches would have to do away with a staff position or just go without an air handler. Other churches would have to cut valuable programs and ministries to cover the cost. We plan for "sudden emergency moments" in the church through the Theo & Belle Moll Society and its generous members.

I want to thank all our current Theo & Belle Moll Society members for their ongoing love and support for our church through the endowment. We cannot do all that we do as a church without you. I want to thank God in advance for all the people who WILL become members of our society in the future. Just as Jesus prayed for those who WILL come to believe in him in the Upper Room that night, so I now pray for you and thank God for your forthcoming generosity. When you hear God call you to be a part of the Theo & Belle Moll Society, please know that you will be helping people meet Jesus Christ in the midst of their story for generations to come. Thank you and may God bless you now and forevermore.

Message from the Board of Trustees

We are grateful to everyone for your faith in Rocky River United Methodist Church and its mission and vision.

Throughout 2021, as trustees of Rocky River United Methodist Church, we continued to be conservative in our decision-making about capital improvements, while also being very thankful that the earnings of the endowment allowed us to quickly respond to any urgent needs.

For example, during the summer, the air handler, which supplies air conditioning to the sanctuary, gave out after more than 60 years of service. We immediately ordered a new one, at a cost of nearly \$50,000. We are grateful that there was no need to cut anything from the church's operating budget to do this. The endowment exists, in part, to pay for capital emergencies such as this.

This report highlights some of the additional projects that were made possible in 2021 by the endowment. You may have noticed new furniture for the welcome center and gathering area outside Beacon Hall, as well as a significant sprucing-up of the grounds and landscaping. Several staff computers were replaced, and roof repairs were completed on the church building and the building at the new 9900 Madison Avenue campus.

Importantly, the endowment continued to provide an annual perpetual tithe from Theo and Belle Moll to the church's operating budget. Modest college scholarships were given to four church youth, and the endowment continued to support a United Methodist missionary.

We are guided in our efforts by the deep faith and commitment expressed for this church by Moll Society members over many decades. We are grateful to everyone for your faith in our church.

Endowment

Major Maintenance and Improvements

Our properties require both short-term and long-term projects to keep them not only functional, but beautiful as well. The endowment, which helps us do this, also helps relieve our annual budget from being overwhelmed with the steady need for capital projects and maintenance.

People and Programs

The people who gather to discover Jesus Christ in the midst of their story find a variety of programs to help them accomplish this goal. Our church seeks to assist everyone to find a place to meet Christ. From Small Groups to Upward Basketball and Cheerleading, from choir to Bible study, there's a place and program for everyone thanks to these funds.

Fulfilling the Needs of Others

These funds allow us to meet a variety of needs in our church, community, and the world through both traditional and new outreach ministries. The ministries seek to help people meet Christ in the midst of their stories such as the support of an overseas missionary and higher education scholarships.

Apportionments

 Income used to supplement the current operating budget in any year the Church is unable to meet its Conference and District Apportionments

Benevolence

- Income used for causes that extend the outreach ministries of the church
- Can be used to augment non-annual major capital improvements and/or major repairs to the sanctuary organ

Capital Development

 Principal and income may be used to provide for major future changes to the church's property, including land and building improvements

Centennial

 Income used for improvement, maintenance, replacement, or repair of any property item believed to have a long-term useful life of more than ten years

Dean

Income used to support church programs

Education

 Income used for higher education scholarships awarded to members each year

Memorial

- All memorial funds given to the church that do not request a specific purpose are directed here
- Principal and income may be used
- Used for altar flowers and special equipment and furnishings as needed

Trustee Discretionary

 Principal and income used to cover necessary projects as directed by the Board of Trustees

Music

Principal and income used to maintain and enhance the music program

Twice Blessed Free Store

 Principal and income used to provide for the ministries, capital expenses, and operation of the Twice Blessed Free Store campus




Spending by Category 2017-2021
