UPWARD SPORTS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!


Upward Sports' 2024 season begins this month. Practices are


REFLECTIONS ...

ISTHERE REALLY A FIRE?

So you hear the fire alarm sound during one of our services. Do you know where the exits are located? Is there really a fire or is this a false alarm? Or maybe it is just a test of the alarm system. What do you do?

What you <u>DON'T</u> want to do is to hesitate and question whether or not there is a real fire. What you <u>DO</u> want to do is to evacuate the church immediately. Unless instructed otherwise, move



quickly (don't run) and quietly to the closest exit and leave the building immediately.

Why do people not respond to fire alarms? People don't like to stop what they are doing, and often a fire alarm is not enough of a cue for people to drop their everyday tasks and exit the building.

Should you respond to every fire alarm? Even when there are no signs of fire, you should react to every fire alarm as if there is an actual fire.

Please be aware of where all of the fire exits are located.

EDUCATION SEMINAR - POWER, PURPOSE & LOVE: BECOMING CHANGE-MAKERS IN OUR COMMUNITIES



SUNDAY, MARCH 3, 2024, 4:00-7:30PM Keynote Speaker and Facilitator: Rev. Joy Fenton-Jones

Rev. Joy Fenton-Jones is an Authorized Minister in the United Church of Christ and a creative thinker about how congregations and their buildings may best serve the community. She serves two churches (DOC/UCC) in Cuyahoga Falls and devotes much time to navigating creative building reuse and church building redevelopment projects with congregations around Greater Cleveland and Akron.

Each one of us desires to make positive change. Whether in our personal lives, in our churches, or in the wider community, we want to leave circumstances better than we have found them. The biblical witness affirms this story: ordinary people, called by God, are catalysts for realizing God's Kin-dom right in their own neighborhoods. Using the tools of grassroots organizing, this seminar will make the case that with God's help and the partnership of our neighbors, we can participate in the transformation of our churches, our neighborhoods and the broader community. We will discover and practice the art of relational meetings; we will unearth the power of community listening; and we will develop a toolkit for breaking down seemingly intractable problems into manageable tasks. This seminar will draw on the work of Robert Linthicum's book, "Transforming Power: Biblical Strategies for Making a Difference in Your Community," and will also include the voices of interfaith community leaders and organizers from Cleveland and Cuyahoga County.

On March 3, there are two ways to attend: in person, meal provided, at RRUMC or on Zoom, with breakout discussion groups and a break. There is no cost to attend. Greetings in the New Year from the Nursery School. As we progress through the long winter months, the PreK will begin assessing our students for progress notes to be handed out during our conferences that are held in early March. The 3s classes are continuing to work with the children on skills needed as they progress through preschool and get closer to their PreK year. The school approaches language and letter recognition as a whole. Each age group is working on the same letter during the week with various activities to enhance this depending on the age. Scaffolding is such an efficient way to ensure the students continue to work through the letters, the sounds that they make and how to blend the sounds together for consecutive years as they progress through RRUMNS. Art and music are also used daily to complete our curriculum. The children are using picture books as well to learn the difference between fiction stories and nonfiction stories. Wordless books also tend to be a big hit at this age. Registration is opening for new and non-church member families on January 9. Information can be found online through the church's website.
